### I. PURPOSE

This Department procedure identifies executive and managerial rank titles within the Department and lists those groups for which they are responsible.

# II. SCOPE

This procedure applies to all members of the Department.

# III. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>

- - A. Assistant Chief accountable to the Executive Assistant Chief and is in charge of one of five offices. They include: Patrol Operations, Centralized Investigations, Neighborhood Policing, Training/Employee Development and Traffic, Youth & Event Services.
  - B. Captain or Manager (Commanding Officer [CO]) accountable to an Assistant Chief and responsible for the management and day-to-day operations of a command and/or division.
  - C. Chief of Police accountable to the Mayor and is the head of the Police Department. The Chief of Police is responsible for the overall administration and operation of the Department.

- D. Chief's Executive Committee (CEC) consists of all chief officers, the Counsel to the Chief, and the City Attorney's legal advisors assigned to the Police Department.
- E. Command Staff consists of chief officers, the Counsel to the Chief, captains and managers.
- F. Executive Assistant Chief accountable to the Chief of Police and is in charge of the overall day-to-day operations of the Department.

### IV. RANK TITLES

The following titles have been adopted to identify the various ranks and titles of the particular group under the charge of that rank.
